ABSTRACT

Press clippings highlighting the achievements of Boston City Councilor David Scondras, official and personal correspondence, and miscellaneous materials relating to Boston-area gay and lesbian organizations between the years 1983 and 1992.

BIOGRAPHICAL/HISTORICAL NOTE

David Scondras, longtime community activist and educator, served as the first openly gay representative elected to the Boston City Council from 1984 to 1994. During his tenure, he advocated tirelessly for the gay and lesbian community, opposing then-Governor Michael Dukakis' decision to deny gay couples the right to adopt, and supported the candidacy of Virginia Apuzzo for the Democratic Presidential nomination in 1988 as an affirmation of gay and lesbian political power. Scondras was also committed to several progressive causes, such as fair and affordable housing in Boston during the time where rapid development threatened to squeeze working class families out of the market, minority rights in the wake of several violent confrontations between Boston police officers and Asian American immigrants, and forcing Coors Beer to end its funding of political extremist groups through a citywide boycott of its products. An early proponent of funding for HIV/AIDS research, Scondras is the founder of Search For A Cure, a Boston-based not for profit organization dedicated to AIDS education, prevention, and research around the globe.

SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

The collection consists of 64 folders. Each folder contains photocopies of press clippings from five major Boston newspapers (*Boston Globe*, *Boston Herald*, *Boston Ledger*, *Boston Tab*, and *Bay Windows*) between the years 1983 and 1992. While some folders are arranged chronologically, with one year of one newspaper's clippings to a folder, others have been arranged thematically and not only contain press clippings but several other material types as well, including both personal and official correspondence, newsletters and official records from various Boston-area gay and lesbian associations, and ephemera.

DESCRIPTION OF SERIES

Series I contains 56 folders. Each folder contains photocopies of press clippings from five major Boston newspapers (*Boston Globe*, *Boston Herald*, *Boston Ledger*, *Boston Tab*, and *Bay Windows*) between the years 1983 and 1992. The folders are arranged chronologically, with one year of one newspaper's clippings to a folder, with no attempt at thematic arrangement or explanation of the selected articles' relevance.

Series II contains 8 folders. Unlike the folders in Series I, these have been arranged thematically and contain primarily correspondence as well as press clippings and various other material types. Also present in Folder 2.8 are unbound issues of several gay and lesbian periodicals, including: *Genre*, *Tom of Finland Foundation Dispatch*, *Out in the Mountains*, *Steam*, *Harvard Gay and Lesbian Review*, *GLBTF*, *Stonewall Library Legacy*, and *One IGLA Bulletin*.
